Airports and Sea Terminals Remain Closed in Hurricane Harvey's Wake

Due to extensive flooding over the weekend from Hurricane Harvey, KWE Houston will remain closed through Monday—more rainfall is expected over the following days. Most of Texas' east coast, Louisiana, and parts of Mississippi have received public alerts for flash floods and evacuations.

[The Federal Aviation Administration](#) (FAA) announced that Houston's two hub airports, George Bush Intercontinental Airport (IAH) and William P. Hobby Airport (HOU), "are expected to remain closed to the public until Wednesday." [The Port of Galveston](#) remains closed until Tuesday, leaving nearly 20,000 cruise ship passengers from disembarking the liners. Likewise, the Port of Houston will also remain closed through Monday as officials evaluated weather conditions for potential reopening on Tuesday.

Hurricane Harvey made landfall at Corpus Christi last Friday night [as a Category 4 hurricane](#) with winds over 100mph, receding offshore periodically before returning to Copano Bay as a downgraded Category 3 hurricane. There have been at least five deaths and a dozen injuries related to Hurricane Harvey.
