The Brussels Airport remains closed on Wednesday and Thursday, and passenger flights have not yet resumed. However, several sources indicate that air freight operations may operate as soon as air-side areas are cleared at Brussels-Zaventem. Nearby ports Antwerp and Zeebrugge have also resumed ocean freight operations.

Since yesterday, many cargo flights have been diverted to Liège airport, about 90 km away from Brussels-Zaventem, as well as the Frankfurt airport in neighboring Germany.

Cargo screening has also been increased following the twin bombings, and shipment delays are still expected as Belgian aviation authorities scan containers with increased scrutiny.

The Brussels suicide bombings that occurred yesterday morning left over 30 dead and more than 250 wounded. One of the suspects currently remains at large. Belgium is currently in mourning, and has issued a Level 4 terror alert—the country has increased security along its borders with countries like France and Germany, and train operations remain shut down.
