Grayson Develops into “Bomb Cyclone” Causing Air Traffic Delays in Eastern U.S.

Conditions have worsened since the onset of Winter Storm Grayson, which has moved North along the Eastern coast of the United States. The storm has apparently undergone bombogenesis, rapidly intensifying in strength to rival that of a hurricane. Operations for various airports have been disrupted, including: Baltimore-Washington (BWI), Charlotte (CLT), Greenville/Spartanburg (GSP), Jacksonville (JAX), Norfolk (ORF), Raleigh Durham (RDU), Richmond (RIC), Washington Reagan (DCA), Philadelphia (PHL), New York/LaGuardia (LGA), and more, according to several major airlines.

Additionally, while the ports of Charleston and Savannah have reopened, ocean terminals in the Port of Virginia are closed for the day. Cargo movement may be impacted in the Eastern states through the week—KWE offices in New York, Philadelphia, and Boston have also closed due to the harsh weather.
