Indonesia Volcano Eruption May Pose Danger to Air Traffic in Coming Days

Over the weekend, Indonesia's Mount Agung, located in Bali, began erupting and created plumes of ash and smoke upwards to 4 kilometers in the sky, causing tens of thousands of residents to evacuate and closure of the island's airport due to adverse flight conditions. Incidentally, the tropical cyclone Cempaka, which came close to the island of Java Monday evening, has also pushed volcanic fumes toward Bali, [alleges meteorology chief Mulyono Prabowo](#). The nearby [Denpasar International Airport remains closed](#), as will Bali's [I Gusti Ngurah Rai International Airport](#), although there have not been reports that Jakarta Airport have ceased operations.
