Typhoon Chaba Batters South Korea, Moves to Japan

After causing shutdowns in South Korean ports and [killing at least five people](#), Typhoon Chaba heads to the southwestern parts of Japan, bringing heavy winds and torrential rainfall with it. The Korean island Jeju was hit on the night of October 5, disrupting outbound and inbound flights to South Korea and China. Busan's port was shut down as the storm raged, and [flights at the Gimhae Airport were canceled](#) due to storm conditions. Shipping routes were reportedly suspended on October 4 when the storm first hit, [according to Arirang News](#).

In preparation for the typhoon's landfall, major Japan airlines including All Nippon Airways and Japan Airlines [have cancelled over 100 flights](#).
