Typhoon Nida Impacts Hong Kong Air and Sea Operations

Over the night of August 1, Typhoon Nida has impacted the city of Hong Kong, with potential to travel further inland to Eastern China.

The [Hong Kong International Airport](#) has cancelled over 100 flights and the Hong Kong Observatory has issued a Tropical Cyclone Warning for Shipping, detailing [characteristics of Nida and its forecasted trajectory](#). Over the weekend, the typhoon passed through the Philippines and flooded northern cities like Tuguegarao with as much as 11 inches of rain.

The Chinese government has [issued a first-level emergency response](#) to prepare for the imminent landfall of Typhoon Nida—all classes and work have been cancelled in the city of Guangzhou for the duration of the typhoon, and sea operations are reportedly on hiatus. A red alert has also been issued by [China's State Oceanic Administration](#) (SOA)
