U.S. Customs Accepting Comments to Improve Trade Regulations

In response to the implementation of [Executive Order 13771 signed January 30th of this year](#), “Reducing Regulation and Controlling Regulatory Costs,” the U.S. Customs and Border Protection has released a statement today seeking comments and information on current trade regulations from interested parties—the agency will accept submissions until December 11, 2017.

In order to better handle suggestions made, CBP has requested that commentators provide specific legal citation where applicable, an explanation on why such a regulation should be modified or repealed, and proposals to achieve the desired changes.
